Personal First aid kit and Emergency

A basic first aid kit includes:

- Waterproof container
- Surgical gloves
- A ziplock "Bio waste bag"
- Summary of first aid and emergency medicine
- Book of basic first aid procedures
- Large roll of 2" wide cloth adhesive tape--not waterproof--on cardboard roll which can be collapsed (can be ripped into narrower strips--warm near skin before using)
- 4" x 4" sterile gauze pads--at least 10
- Ace bandage
- Moleskin
- Band-aids
- Triangle bandage
- 2 single-edged razor blades in sterile packages
- 1 pair tweezers
- 1 pair scissors
- Thermometer
- Aspirin
- Betadine antiseptic
- Aqueous zepharin-clear antiseptic
- Antacid tablets
- Milk of magnesia tablets
- Tube of Vaseline
- Instant ice compress (in summer)
- Sterile moist wipes in foil or equivalent

Recipes

- Cut off the back of boxes that have the recipes on them.
- Copy or photo copy recipes

Shopping List

- Make a shopping list before going to the store.
- Items from menu and checklist.
- Keep receipts so the cost of the trip can be calculated
 - o Food, Equipment, Carpool, camp fees, permit fees...

Preparation

Pre-bag ingredients (Remove from all that packaging. Take only what you needs.)

Calculate the cost of the trip and let patrol members the cost. Collect and pay back those who has expenses.

Getting to destination

- City/ road map for each driver
- Topo map and trail maps if available

Camp Set-up

- Survey areas and find best places for dinning fly tents and fire pits.
- Set up dinning fly first tis will give packs and scout protection from the rain or sun.
- Set tents up by patrols with cooking areas
- Determine areas for cat holes and latrine (200 ft or 75 paces)
- Find tree to cache store the food
- Set up patrol flags and have a ceremony to post the American flag

Continue with camp agenda

Come home, dry out pack, sleeping bag and tents
